Private schools existed, but only for the very rich, and there were very few public schools because of the strong sentiment that children who would grow up to be laborers should not "waste" their time on education but should instead prepare themselves for their life's work.

It was in the face of this public sentiment that educational **reformers** set about their task. Horace Mann, probably the most famous of the reformers, felt that there was no excuse in a republic for any citizen to be uneducated. As Superintendent of Education in the state of Massachusetts from 1837 to 1848, he initiated various changes, which were soon matched in other

school districts around the country. He extended the school year from five to six months and improved the quality of teachers by instituting teacher education and raising teacher salaries. Although these changes did not bring about a sudden improvement in the educational system, they as least increased public awareness as to the need for a further strengthening of the system.

Each society has its own beliefs, attitudes, customs, behaviors and social habits. These give people a sense of who they are, how they are supposed to <u>behave</u>, and what they should do or should not do.

People become <u>conscious</u> of such rules when they meet people from different cultures. For example, the rules about when to eat vary from culture to culture.
